Re: Improving access to the Court - Employment Court Introduction Video

The Judges of Te Kōti Take Mahi o Aotearoa/the Employment Court of New Zealand are acutely aware that the courtroom environment is an unfamiliar and daunting place for many of our Court users. We have been working to improve access to the Court, including through the provision of on-line resources.

As you may be aware, the Court's website currently contains a range of useful material, including the supports available for physical access and for those who are hearing impaired, how to obtain translation services, where to find various documents and forms, and what steps to take to progress or respond to a claim. There are also photographs of a typical courtroom layout: <u>What happens during a hearing | Employment Court of New Zealand</u>; maps of our court premises and information on nearby parking options and public transport: <u>Our Courthouses - practical guidance | Employment Court of New Zealand</u>.

We have now added a video to our website - "Employment Court Introduction". It shows a mock Court hearing, explaining the role of the Employment Court, the participants in a hearing and demonstrating some of the processes that often occur, e.g. the swearing in of a witness. It was put together by former Judge Bruce Corkill with the assistance of practitioners Karen Radich and Paul McBride, and Court staff Patrick Davidson, Holly Kerr and Suzanne Innes-Kent.
